

Douglaston Garden Club September Newsletter 2025

Welcome back to a new session of the Douglaston Garden Club. By this time, you should have received the new schedule and the list of DGC Board Members and Committee Chairs and Co-Chairs. If you have not received this information, I am attaching it to this Newsletter.

But first some news from Sarah Milunec, the chair of the Environmental Committee. Sarah is concerned about the damage being done by an invasion of lantern flies. Here is what she discovered and what she recommends:



I cannot emphasize the importance of killing the spotted lantern fly in our area. We have learned more about this invasive insect. It is important that we kill the insect and kill the eggs otherwise then next year will be worse. Please google for pictures of Lantern fly stages, and their eggs.

We do know that they have no enemies or predators YET and therefore, it is up to us to do as much as we can. We are starting to see birds eating the lantern flies; however, they have not fully acquired a taste for this insect.

Lantern flies do not travel far but it is important to know that if you see them on your property, you must kill them or you will have more next year.

If we look at Pennsylvania, where this started a couple of years before New York they have so many now that they are vacuuming the flies on and around the trees because they cannot kill them fast enough.

The Lantern fly sucks the sap out of a tree and eventually the tree will die.

What can we do? If each one of us plants a milk thistle plant It will help the butterflies, but it is poisonous to the Lantern Flies. We will help beauty but kill the beast.

Formula for a NATURAL pesticide mix in a spray bottle.

One quart of water

1/4 cup non-detergent dish soap

Example: Dawn

one tablespoon of vegetable oil

Place duct tape sticky side out on your trees outside or any tree you have seen them on.

Place tape three feet above the ground. It catches them like a fly trap.

Kill egg masses. Scrap off and place in alcohol in a zip lock bag and seal shut. They prefer to lay eggs on smooth surfaces. Example: vinyl siding, patio furniture, cars and especially the wheel well of a car.
