It's My Park Days APRIL 29 and 30, 2017 at Catharine Turner Richardson Park

On Saturday April 29 and Sunday April 30, passers-by will have noticed a great resurgence of activities and presences at the Catharine Turner-Richardson Park. The turnout of volunteers exceeded all expectations! A tremendous amount of work was achieved. In all, over 50 volunteers came, worked from 9 am to 4pm on Saturday and from 10 am to 3pm on Sunday and filled over 40 bags of garbage + a huge tree stump. Below are listed all those who participated and that I want to officially thank from the bottom of my heart:

Joe Block, our NY City Parks Department Manager who came as a Santa Claus on Xmas day with everything we needed to make it happen from rakes, brooms, shovels, axes, paint, brushes, seeds and much more. He fixed up our DGC Park sign that is now right side up! He directed and encouraged volunteers ALL DAY LONG. Without him and his patience, I would not have been able to pull off this event. It is a pleasure to know him and to work with him. Thanks to him also, we had the pleasure to meet the actual NYC Parks Department team who is responsible for the care of our park: **Claudine and her crew of 5**. What a pleasure it was to meet those wonderful volunteers coming from another Queens neighborhood to help make our little corner of this world more beautiful. They raked and bagged and weeded the front lawn for hours in a row, they refreshed the beige paint on the 2-water boxes.

Neighborhood volunteers came as well: Laurie Killcommons from the Wesley building, Christine Marchese from Depew Ave, Christine Briguglio and her son Evan from East Drive. From the Prospect Ave side, Chris and Suzanne Campese, Julia Dobry with their families also raked and bagged for hours without getting discouraged by a few nasty surprises left by our canine visitors (whose owners are regrettably not very responsible, a sad fact-of-life).
